Follow These Steps to Earn Your AAS Degree

- 1 TRANSFER** any credits from other colleges that you have attended. Do this by requesting that your other college(s) send an official transcript to: Mt. Hood Community College, Admissions & Records Office, 26000 SE Stark Street, Gresham, OR 97030, or *emailed to ar@mhcc.edu*.
- 2 COMPLETE** MHCC's online graduation application and upload a picture of your Journey card: mhcc.edu/AR/GraduationApplication.aspx (select Associate of Applied Science degree, Apprenticeship, (AAS) degree). If applicable, provide a copy of your **DD214**. At this time, transcripts that have been received will be evaluated. When MHCC receives your Graduation Application, the college will conduct a degree audit and let you know what courses, if any, you'll need to earn your degree. You can take these courses at MHCC (online options available). Or they can be taken at another college and transferred in, if needed.
- 3 REGISTER** for any needed classes. Prior to registering for a class, you may need to (re)apply for admissions and/or take a placement test. To apply or reapply, visit mhcc.edu/admissions, and to take a placement test log on to mhcc.edu/CPT
- 4 GRADUATE** with an AAS degree and launch your new career with confidence!

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APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS - Complete all required courses in an apprenticeship program curriculum.

Complete a minimum of 90 credits. 24 credits must be earned from MHCC. Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 for all courses being applied toward the degree and maintain a 2.00 GPA in the candidate's major classes. Students must have a minimum cumulative MHCC GPA of 2.0 at the time the degree is awarded. Repeated courses may be counted only once toward graduation unless specified in the course description. A maximum of nine credit hours of PE 185, 15 credit hours of IECC201 level or 12 credits of Cooperative Education internship may be applied to this degree as elective credit. Up to 22 credits of credit for prior certification may be awarded for the Journey Card.
